The Connecticut Department of Transportation is announcing the following Walk Bridge Program activities for Saturday, January 6, 2018 through Saturday, January 13, 2018.

RAILROAD ACTIVITY

- Tree clearing work is anticipated to occur along the east side of the Danbury Branch Line between Marshall Street and Science Road, Monday, January 8 through Wednesday, January 10, 2018 from 7:00 AM-4:00 PM. No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated. [Map](#)
