Railroad Activity

Track work on the [Danbury Branch](#) between Marshall Street and Jennings Place

- Monday, October 8 - Friday, October 12 from 6:30 AM - 4:30 PM
- No impacts to local roads or pedestrian traffic are anticipated
- Watch for the entering and exiting of construction vehicles
- Noise and construction illumination are anticipated

Nighttime track work on the [Danbury Branch](#) between Marshall Street and Jennings Place

- Thursday, October 11 from 10:00 PM - 6:00 AM
- No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated
- Noise and construction illumination are anticipated

Local Road Activity

Nighttime road closure on [N. Water Street](#) and [East Avenue](#) to facilitate paving

- Monday, October 8 from 9:00 PM - 5:00 AM
- One lane of alternating one-way traffic will be maintained

- Paving work also take place in the Lock Building parking lot
- Noise and construction illumination are anticipated

Road closure of [Ann Street](#) to facilitate steel erection work

- Ann Street will be closed continuously from Tuesday, October 9 - Friday, October 12

- Pedestrians are encouraged to use Marshall Street
- Noise is anticipated

Drainage work on [Goldstein Place](#)

- Friday, October 5 - Sunday, October 14 from 6:30 AM - 10:00 PM
- One lane of alternating one-way traffic will be maintained
- A shoulder closure on Fort Point Street may occur
- Local business, resident and pedestrian access will be maintained
- Temporary impacts to a few parking spaces may occur
- Noise and construction illumination are anticipated

- Thursday, October 11 from 12:00 PM - 8:00 PM on the Osborne Avenue Bridge
- Friday, October 12 from 4:00 PM - 8:00 PM on the northeast abutment of the Walk Bridge
- One lane of alternating one-way traffic will be maintained on East Avenue, Fort Point Street and Osborne Avenue
- Local business, resident and pedestrian traffic will be maintained
- Noise and construction illumination are anticipated

Additional Activity

Rock grinding on the south side of the New Haven Line, between [Howard Avenue and Bridge Street](#)

- Friday, October 5 - Tuesday, October 9 from 6:30 AM - 4:30 PM and Wednesday, October 10 - Sunday October 14 during daytime and nighttime hours.
- Work is expected during daytime and nighttime hours, Wednesdays - Sundays for the foreseeable future
- Wednesdays - Fridays from 6:30 AM - 3:30 PM and 10:00 PM - 6:00 AM
- Work will occur continuously starting at 10:00 PM on Friday nights - 10:00 PM Sunday nights
- No impacts to local roads, rail service or pedestrian traffic are anticipated
- Noise is anticipated

One of the oldest movable bridges in the country, the Walk Bridge is a critical transportation link on the Northeast Corridor between Washington, D.C., New York City and Boston carrying four tracks of Metro-North Railroad, Amtrak and freight service.
