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**Subject:** East Ave Design Project

On Friday, March 15, 2019, Rilling, Harry <[hrilling@norwalkct.org](mailto:hrilling@norwalkct.org)> wrote:

> Dear Commissioners,

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> The City is at a critical point to be able to facilitate the undergrounding of utilities on East Avenue as part of the roadway reconstruction. As you are aware, the City is designing the roadway improvements and funding potential underground utilities, but Walk Bridge program's contractor will perform the utility work as part of an advanced breakout project. 90% plans are due to the Walk Bridge program manager by May 4th, for June distribution. The City is requesting cooperation from TTD to enable our design work to move forward.

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> Some background:

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> · The City has/is advancing capital funds to make underground utilities possible

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> · Designing TTDs underground option does not commit TTD to anything as the City will pay for the design. Once designed, TTD would decide whether to move forward with implementing it

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> · The City is working with all the fiber companies to get off the telephone poles and is planning to relocate them (\$) regardless of TTD's decision

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> · Road widening requires the telephone poles to be move if the underground is not possible

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> · If poles eliminated, the City needs to design new street lighting for the area

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> · TTD has indicated that they would like to "monetize" 215 East Avenue which is an ideal location to realign the ENRR Sta driveway with the to be signalized Fort Point Street intersection

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> There is tremendous potential for this area and the City strongly desires to work in partnership with TTD to improve this gateway to East Norwalk.

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> I am requesting permission for my staff to work with Kevin Barber and appropriate TTD staff to complete the design work. Kevin has indicated he cannot speak to the City without Commission approval.

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> Please let us know if we are authorized to work with TTD staff or if you need additional information.

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
