Reduction In Power Cost Adjustment



On August 25th The Third Taxing District Commission approved a reduction in the Power Cost Adjustment from \$0.0301/kWh to \$0.0276/kWh effective September 1, 2025. Residential customers who use 700 kWh can expect to see a reduction in their electric bill of approximately 1.3% or \$1.75 a month.



Back-to-School Electrical Safety for Children

Dear parents ~ Start by showing children how to treat electrical outlets with care. All outlets in the home should have safety covers to prevent little fingers or toys from being inserted. Explain that outlets are not toys, and only adults should plug things in or out.

Many kids use nightlights, tablets, or small lamps in their rooms. Make sure cords are in good condition - no frays or exposed wires and placed where children won't trip over them. Talk to your child about not pulling on cords or yanking them from the wall, as this can damage the cord or outlet.

Water and electricity never mix, so remind your child to keep drinks and wet hands away from anything plugged in. Devices like tablets or laptops should only be used with clean, dry hands and far from water sources.

If your child uses a backpack with a built-in charger or power bank, teach them to charge it safely – never under a pillow or blanket, and never overnight. These devices can overheat if not used properly.

Finally, set a good example. Kids learn by watching, so practicing safe habits yourself will reinforce the importance of being careful around electricity.

By taking a few minutes to talk about these safety tips, you can help your young child develop good habits that will keep them safe throughout the school year – and beyond.
